Record Books!

The Central Kansas Free Fair gave us lots of opportunities to see your outstanding project work and the dedicated time you've put into your projects all year. As we finish up the 4-H year (October 1 - September 31), it's important to take time to document the things you've done, what you've learned, and what you'd like to work on in the future. That can all be done through your 4-H record keeping.

Copied below are details and quick links to the forms and applications to help you wrap up the year. **Please be** respectful of the time and dedication of your club leaders by following club due dates for these forms.

Chisholm Trail District 4-H Awards and Recognition Age Divisions

• Three age divisions: junior (7-9 years), intermediate (10-13 years), and senior (14+ years)

• Junior and intermediate division will be judged by the county awards and recognition committee. Dickinson County senior division will be judged by Marion County, Marion County senior division will be judged by Dickinson County.

• Those 13-year olds who will be 14 for the next 4-H year may choose to participate in the senior division, but must use the 14 years+ form

Forms and Scoring

• 4-Hers are to use the **Project Report form** that is designed for their age group (7-9 year olds, 10 -13 year olds, and 14+ years) and project area (general or animal).

• The **Simplified Kansas 4-H Record** form may be used for project completion related to Achievement Pin requirements, but will not be judged.

- Organizational leaders will submit records for judging and indicate those projects that are to be evaluated.
- All submitted project records will be scored on the Danish system (purple, blue, red, white) utilizing the Kansas

4-H Project Report Evaluation Score Sheet. Those receiving purples or blues in each project will be ranked. • In Dickinson County, medals will be awarded to the top ranked equal to 10% of the number of youth in the project, in that age division. Ribbons will be awarded to those receiving blues or purples who do not receive a medal.

• The top book in each project from the senior division in each county will be eligible to advance to area screening. The top two books in a project area from a single county will advance if there is not a senior book available from the other county.

• Bucket calf is only available in the junior and intermediate divisions

Kansas 4-H Accidental Insurance

Kansas 4-H will continue to provide accidental insurance under a statewide group activity accident policy for 4-H members and volunteers through American Income Life. Volunteer Screening Process

Our 4-H program relies on volunteers to accomplish our Positive Youth Development goals. As a part of our commitment to these goals is the desire to provide a safe environment for learning. To help accomplish this, Kansas 4-H screens volunteers who work directly with youth. As a potential or current volunteer, we ask you to complete the screening process. This process will be accomplished through 4HOnline. As you set up your profile after October 1st, the system will take you through the volunteer screening process. If it's your first time applying, please complete the Outside Background Check and contact Jill for a new volunteer interview. Additional details on our volunteer page. **NOTE: once completed initially, the outside background check only needs to be completed every three years and can be accomplished by letting our office know to re-submit your information.**

Online Volunteer Orientation

The Volunteer Orientation needs to be completed by everyone applying to be a 4-H volunteer. It only needs to be done one time. You will need to be enrolled as an individual in your family's **4HOnline account in order to access the training.** Instructions are available at https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/4-h-online/index.html. The course consists of video modules and quizzes. Please let our office know when you have completed the orientation.

Standards for Participation in Kansas FFA and 4-H Youth Development Educational Opportunities

The purpose of the standards outlined below are to assist in determining eligible participation in FFA and/or 4-H Youth Development learning experiences. Both 4-H and Agriculture Education/FFA promote teaching youth life skills. Each program exists to maximize the participants' knowledge of agriculture and its value to our communities while educating the young people to become productive citizens. Eligible youth may participate in both 4-H and FFA but should avoid duplication. The following standards of participation are used in delivering the 4-H and FFA programs in Kansas.

- 1. Agriculture Education teachers, FFA Advisors, Extension staff and local volunteers are encouraged to cooperate in sharing information and resources to provide educational opportunities for youth.

- 2. When young people are members of both 4-H and FFA, they must plan and manage separate projects, and/or supervised agriculture experiences (SAE) programs.

- 3. FFA and 4-H members may enroll in the same area of experience in 4-H and FFA, however; participants cannot identify, nominate, manage, keep records on, or exhibit the same plants, animals, etc. in both organizations. Members must designate exhibits as either FFA or 4-H at weigh-in, registration or similar deadline.
- 4. Members may participate in judging contests and related events in FFA and 4-H but cannot represent both organizations at a contest, show or event at the same time.

- 5. When 4-H and FFA are conducting collaborating activities, both the 4-H and FFA organizations must be represented through emblems and information on all signs, print materials and awards.

- 6. Collaborating FFA and 4-H activities or events are obligated to have supervision representation from both organizations.

The standards are in agreement with Kansas 4-H and FFA and hereby affirmed by members and professionals in order to participate in either educational program.

4-H Club New Family Mentors

In 4-H we "learn by doing" which can often cause new families to feel lost until they've experienced a 4-H event or activity. To help ease their anxiety and keep our new families engaged, clubs are encouraged to recruit an adult volunteer (who is not currently an organizational leader) to serve as a New Family Mentor. This individual will be responsible for checking in with new 4-H families and help them understand more about Dickinson County 4-H. Let us know who your club's new family mentor is when you turn in your club leader list by **December 1**!

Cloverbud Information

Kansas State Research and Extension and 4-H Youth Development offers 4-H Cloverbuds, an educational program designed specifically for youth ages five and six. Children of this age have distinctive learning characteristics and developmental needs that are different from older youth who participate in 4-H. That is why the 4-H Cloverbud program is designed with specific educational objectives and policies focused on the 5- and 6-year-old child.

- 4-H Cloverbuds is activity-focused, rather than project-focused.
- The 4-H Cloverbud programming is cooperative, rather than competitive.
- 4-H Cloverbud exhibits can be showcased at fairs and public events, but a 4-H Cloverbud member may not participate as a competitive exhibitor in traditional 4-H events.
- A ratio of two adults to 12 4-H Cloverbud members (2:12) is required.
- 4-H Cloverbuds requires a safe environment.
