Record keeping and project reporting are super important skills you learn as part of the Kansas 4-H program. You're encouraged to keep a permanent record of all your 4-H and non-4-H experiences; everything from club meetings to community service to cool personal achievements!

To get recognized for your hard work, make sure to fill out the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form. It's your chance to shine and show what you've learned and accomplished! Need help? Check out the Guide to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition. It's packed with tips to help you through the process.

The 2026 State 4-H Youth Leadership Council will be elected and up to six National 4-H Conference delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF. 4-H Enrollment

4-H Enrollment Opens on October 1st and closes on May 1st. The enrollment process takes place online at: 4honline.com. It is recommended to get enrolled prior to December 1st to utilize the coupon code and start receiving 4-H information.

A few key things regarding Enrollment:

- Fill out all the forms – including consents
- Include solid contact information – this is how we communicate
- Sign up for any project area that the member may be interested in – the fair entry system only allows you to make a fair entry in the projects you are enrolled in (doesn't mean you have to have a fair entry for that project)
- Coupon Code for reduced enrollment fees – the state 4-H office hasn't given us this yet. It will be distributed to club leaders when we receive it. NOTE: The coupon code is only valid till December 1st.

4-H Officer Training

We will be offering Officer Training for all of club officers again this year. This event will cover the roles/duties of each office and include a parliamentary procedure and project talk activity. 4-H Council will be determining a date & time for the event at their October meeting on the 12th, so stay tuned!

Entrepreneurship
